Olentangy The Condominium Court Rules

- An entry Key is required.
- Courts are available from 8am until sunset
- Courts are for residents and their guests only
- Limit to 3 guests and 1 court per resident
- You must accompany your guests at all times when they are on the court
- Do not give your key to a guest. Failure to comply will result in violation fines
- No more than 4 individuals are allowed on a court at any given time
- Court use is on a first-come, first-serve basis. If others are waiting, play is limited to one hour per group
- Courts are for pickleball and tennis ONLY. (soccer, futsal, volleyball, etc. are prohibited)
- No person under 12 years old is permitted without an adult
- Limit excess noise no yelling, music, speakers, amplifiers, or public address systems are allowed
- Keep courts clean residents are responsible for removing all equipment, personal items & trash after every use
- No food, glass containers, weapons, smoking, vaping, or alcoholic beverages in the court area
- No bikes, rollerblades, roller skates, skateboards, motorized vehicles, lawn chairs, or other toys allowed inside the fence
- No pets allowed in the court area
- Please close the gate during play and upon exiting the courts
- The rules of pickleball/tennis etiquette are to be observed
- Proper athletic attire and tennis shoes must be worn inside the court no wet swimsuits or black soled shoes

However, unlike a detached house, condo living thrives on a delicate balance of personal freedom and collective responsibility. The key to a peaceful and enjoyable community lies in good "condo etiquette" - the unwritten (and sometimes written) rules of respectful cohabitation.

Being a good condo neighbor isn't just about avoiding complaints; it's about fostering a welcoming and positive environment for everyone. Noise is often the number one source of condo disputes. Being mindful of your sound footprint is paramount. Keep music, television and pets at a reasonable volume. Schedule noisy repairs during the hours of 9am. and 5pm. and inform your neighbors in advance of any noisy construction or remodeling you are having done.

Common areas are extensions of your home, and their upkeep affects everyone. Always clean up after yourself when using the pool, courts, exercise room or club house. Use designated recycling and trash bins correctly and please break down cardboard boxes.

Pets are beloved family members, but their presence requires extra consideration in a multi-family community. Always keep your dog on a leash. Clean up after your pet immediately and dispose of the pickup bag in the dumpsters.

Even with the best intentions, issues can arise. If a problem arises with a neighbor, try to address it directly and politely. If you receive a complaint, take it seriously and try to remedy the situation.

Condo living is about shared spaces and a shared commitment to a high quality life. By practicing good condo etiquette, you're not just being a polite neighbor you're actively contributing to a harmonious, respectful, and enjoyable community for everyone.

No pool, exercise room or court privileges are included with the rental of the Lodge.

Pool Rules

- Absolutely no diving! The pool is now just 6ft. deep at the waterfall end.
- No glass bottles of any kind in the pool area!
- Guests must be accompanied by a resident/unit owner at all times.
- Children under the age of 14 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- Children cannot be left unattended.
- Running, rollerblading and/or horseplay are not permitted in the pool area.
- Please be considerate of others and keep your music and conversation at a low level.
- No food is allowed in the swimming pool.

Guests are limited to six (6) per unit. You must accompany your guests at all times when they are in the pool area. Do not give your key to a guest.

Backboards, rings, hooks and ropes, etc., are provided by law and are for your safety and protection, not for use as toys. An emergency phone is provided for your use; it is only to be used in an emergency and is pre-programmed to call 911.

Do not give your key to your guests! Failure to comply with these rules may result in loss of pool privileges or fines.



Red, White and Boom Celebration will be held in Columbus on July 3rd. In the City of Columbus, fireworks are generally prohibited. Consumer varieties of fireworks may be legal in parts of Ohio but Columbus City Ordinance prohibits the use of fireworks that explode, go into the air or move on the ground. Approved fireworks within our city limits include sparklers, smokes, snaps, snakes and Fountains. No one under the age of 18 is allowed to light fireworks.
